



The following criteria determine the Skaters listed in the ISU Testing Pools, either Registered Testing Pool (RTP) or ISU Testing Pool (TP).

- The ranking of the following ISU competitions during the previous season:
  - **Figure Skating**
    - World Figure Skating Championships
    - World Junior Figure Skating ChampionshipsFor both ladies and men skaters ranked in each discipline of Figure Skating (singles Men and Ladies, Pairs and Ice Dance).
  - **Speed Skating**
    - World Allround Championships
    - World Sprint Championships
    - World Cup Final Classification of each distanceFor both ladies and men skaters ranked.
  - **Short Track Speed Skating**
    - World Short Track Speed Skating Championships
    - World Short Track Junior Championships
    - World Cup Final Classification of each distanceFor both ladies and men skaters ranked.
- The ranking of the 2018 Olympic Winter Games in PyeongChang (KOR).
- The ISU risk assessment.
- The Athlete Biological Passport of each Skater.

Additional Skaters may be added in any ISU Testing Pools by the ISU based on Testing results (urine and/or blood) and performance.

According to article 5.7.1 of the ISU Anti-Doping Rules (Communication No. 1922), a Skater who is retiring or temporarily not participating in any ISU Event must give written notice to the ISU to be removed from any ISU Testing Pool.

Additionally, any Skater who is not on the above list but could be entered for a major Event (World Championships, Olympic Winter Games) may also be included in any ISU Testing Pools.

The ISU Testing Pools will be reviewed periodically and modified if necessary based on performance and/or Testing results (urine and/or blood).
