The health and safety of all participants of the ISU events remains the number one priority for the International Skating Union (ISU).

As part of the Covid-19 testing procedures during the ISU World Speed Skating Championships in Hamar (Norway) numerous antigen and PCR tests have been performed on site. Amongst these numerous tests, two positive cases were identified and confirmed. The ISU and Organizing Committee will respect the privacy of the respective persons and informed the remaining Event Participants internally of the situation. The persons and all close contacts have been isolated and the local health authorities are following up with all mandatory procedures and policies.

The ISU, Organizing Committees and local health authorities continue to take care of the safety and health of all participants.

The protocols as set out in the [ISU Guidelines for ISU Events during the COVID-19 pandemic](#) and the [Speed Skating Guidelines](#) are being followed.
