





THE VENUE

Each year **Stockholm Globe Arenas** provide 2 million visitors with more than 300 world class events in sport, music and entertainment. Our four arenas (Ericsson Globe, Hovet, Annexet, and Tele2 Arena) and the new tourist attraction SkyView form the largest sport and entertainment district in Scandinavia.


Main arena

Ericsson Globe is the world's largest spherical building built in 1989 and its unique shape has become a symbol for Stockholm and Sweden. Each day people from all over the world come to look at this curious architecture with its clever construction solutions. For example, the arena can very swiftly be

transformed from an ice hockey rink to a gala dinner hall or from a horse jumping arena to a table tennis arena.

Practice rink

In direct conjunction with Ericsson Globe we have the practice rink – Hovet, just a few meters from the main arena and the official hotel, Quality Hotel Globe, reachable by an indoor pathway corridor.







OFFICIAL HOTEL

The official hotel, Quality Hotel Globe, is in the same building as the main arena and the practice rink. Therefore, no transportation between the hotel, main arena and practice rink is needed.

Quality Hotel Globe ****

The Quality Hotel Globe is the official hotel for the Competitors, Team Leaders, Team Managers, Coaches, ISU, ISU Office Holders, Event Officials, Team Officials and Team Medical Staff.

Quality Hotel Globe is one of Stockholm larger hotels situated next to Ericsson Globe in Stockholm, 5 km from the city center.

There are 524 rooms, most of them newly built in 2014, and the rest were renovated in 2007. The hotel rooms are well equipped with a bath or shower, TV, trouser press, iron, hairdryer and wifi. The hotel provides a bistro, breakfast room, arena restaurant and a bar.

Based on the first entries, Member federations will kindly be asked to make a pre-payment and latest upon arrival in Stockholm, Member federations are required to settle full payment at registration.

All hotel extras, including services such as telephone charges, Pay TV, room service, mini bar laundry and dry cleaning, are to be settled directly at the hotel upon checkout. All Pay TV Channels and telephones will be blocked upon check-in, and can




TRAVEL INFORMATION

VISA

Please verify with the Swedish Embassy or Consulate in your country whether you need a Visa. Please visit the Swedish Foreign Department's website to obtain information, www.ud.se.

Nordic citizens and citizens from countries within the Schengen area may enter Sweden without presenting their passport, but for identification purpose it is strongly recommended to bring your passport.

For citizens from other countries a valid passport is necessary.

Travel to Stockholm

By air

Stockholm-Arlanda Airport is Sweden's largest Airport. Stockholm-Arlanda Airport is the primary gateway to Stockholm and Sweden. Some 70 airlines serve non-stop scheduled routes to 140 destinations. Scandinavian Airlines System (SAS) and Star Alliance has the largest number of non-stop flight connections to and from Stockholm to international destinations.

Reaching Stockholm by sea

Stockholm harbor is centrally located and several major ferry lines run to and from Helsinki, Turku, Tallinn, Riga, St. Petersburg and many more cities around the Baltic sea

Reaching Stockholm by train

Getting to Sweden by train from Europe is quick and easy, especially due to the Öresund Bridge between Denmark and Sweden. The state-owned rail company SJ runs most long-distance

routes from Oslo, Copenhagen, Berlin and domestic routes in Sweden, to Stockholm.

The city has one main train station, Stockholm Central Station located in the city center. From the Central Station/T-Centralen, it is only 10 minutes by metro to the Stockholm Globe arena and Stockholm Quality Globe Hotel.

Arrival & departures

Official Transportation

Based on the arrival and departure information received in a timely manner from the teams, the OC will provide transportation at arrival and departure only between the Official Hotel, Quality Hotel Globe and the Stockholm-Arlanda Airport, the Harbor of Stockholm (Värtahamnen, Stadsgården and Frihamnen) and the Stockholm Central Station. The transportation will be provided for Teams, ISU Office Holders, and Event Officials. The accredited members of the Official Team Delegation will only have transportation provided if they travel with the team.

The OC requests that teams schedule their arrivals for Tuesday, April 3, as this will be the primary transportation day. Furthermore, the OC will provide departure shuttle buses on Sunday, April 8, only. Please note that teams arriving prior to April 3, or leaving after April 8, will be responsible for all transportation charges

Event shuttle

The official hotel, the main arena and the practice rink are in the same building complex and therefore transportation is not necessary.





ACCREDITATION

All ISU Office Holders, Referees, Judges, Technical Controllers, Technical Specialists, Data and Video Operators, Competitors, Team Leaders, Team Officials, Team Medical Staff, Coaches and Partner or Relative to an Official taking part in the event must register upon arrival at the official hotel – The Quality Hotel Globe.

There will be two accreditation centers:

- **Quality Hotel Globe** for ISU and Teams in the Accreditation Room, Tuesday, April 3 - 09.00 until Thursday, April 6.
- **Main Arena** for Media, TV & Volunteers and late arriving teams and guests, from Sunday, April 1 - 09.00 until Saturday, April 7.

Exact operating hours to be confirmed in accordance with the arrival schedule.

MEAL SERVICE

Teams

All accredited persons that do not receive meal vouchers from the Organizing Committee need to pre-order their lunches and dinners. The Teams, Coaches and Team officials are encouraged to utilize the meal service negotiated by the Organizing Committee. The use of the services is upon Teams' discretion and at their own cost. The price for lunch or dinner is 250 SEK.

ISU Event Officials and Judges

The judges and other ISU competition officials entitled to the full board will receive vouchers for daily meals. Breakfast, lunch and dinner (or late dinner) are served at the Quality Hotel Globe. Meals will be served in buffet style. On the day of evening events the persons provided with the meal tickets may choose either dinner or late dinner. The serving for the both buffet will be equal.

Climate

In April, Stockholm is in springtime and the temperature is usually around 5°C. It is daylight for approximately 6 hours a day and the weather changes quickly.

Currency

Swedish kronor (SEK)= 1 krona =100 öre
August 2014, 1 Euro (EUR) = 9.61 Swedish kronor (SEK)
1 Swedish krona (SEK) 0,10 = Euro (EUR)

Credit cards

All major credit cards are accepted in Sweden. Most hotels, shops, restaurants and taxi accept VISA and Master Card. American express may not be accepted in some cases.

VAT

VAT is always included in the price presented to the customers/guests in shops, hotels, restaurants etc. Tipping in restaurants is not mandatory, but 5-10 % is customary if you receive good service.

Banks

Usually open from 10:00 – 15:00 Monday to Friday. Saturday and Sunday closed.

Electricity

Electrical sockets are 220-240 V AC 50 Hz, using 2 pin plug.

ABBA, The Museum is more than an ordinary museum. Naturally, the members' costumes, gold records, original items, memorabilia, and much, much more are here. 
Fotografiska is one of the world's largest meeting places for contemporary photography. Fotografiska presents four unique large exhibitions and about 20 smaller exhibitions annually. www.fotografiska.eu

The Vasa Museum is the only preserved seventeenth-century ship in the world, and a unique art treasure. More than 95 percent of the ship is original, and it is decorated with hundreds of carved sculptures. The 69 meter-long warship Vasa sank on its maiden voyage in the middle of Stockholm in 1628, and was salvaged 333 years later in 1961. Today the Vasa Museum is the most visited museum in Scandinavia, with

over one million visitors a year. Tours of the museum take place every day. www.vasamuseet.se

City Hall, with its spire featuring the golden Three Crowns, is one of the most famous silhouettes in Stockholm. Guided tours are available all year round. The City Hall is built from eight million bricks, and the 106 meter tall tower has the three crowns, which is the Swedish national coat of arms, at its apex. The great Nobel banquet is also held in City Hall. After dinner in Blå hallen, the Blue Hall, Nobel Prize recipients, royalty and guests dance in Gyllene salen, the Golden Hall, with its 18 million gold mosaic tiles. The Closing Reception Dinner will be held here. www.stockholm.se/OmStockholm/Stadshuset

Gamla Stan, the Old City is one of the largest and best preserved medieval city centers in Europe, and one of the foremost attractions in Stockholm. This is where Stockholm was founded in 1252. All of Gamla Stan and the adjacent island of Riddarholmen are like a living pedestrian-friendly museum

full of sights, attractions, restaurants, cafés, bars and places to shop. Gamla Stan is also popular with aficionados of handicrafts, curios and souvenirs. www.stockholmgamlastan.se

The Royal Palace. Welcome to one of the largest palaces in Europe! The Royal Palace is the official residence of His Majesty the King of Sweden, with over 600 rooms. The Palace is open to the public and offers no less than five museums. The Palace was largely built during the eighteenth century in the Italian Baroque style, on the spot where the "Tre Kronor" castle burned down in 1697. While there make sure not to miss the parade of soldiers and the daily changing of the guard. www.kungahuset.se

SkyView is the new world-class attraction that takes you to the top of the world's largest spherical building, the Ericsson Globe, a Stockholm landmark. From the apex 130 meters (425 feet) above sea level, you get a fantastic view encompassing all of Stockholm. The two SkyView gondolas depart every 10 minutes, and the entire visit takes about 30 minutes. www.stockholm.live.com/skyview/om-skyview

Svenskt Tenn

In October 1924, Svenskt Tenn opens its doors and is today a world famous interior business. "Made in Sweden" has always been and will always be highly regarded at Svenskt Tenn. Basically the entire range is manufactured in Sweden. Eighty per cent of Svenskt Tenn's range consists of products that are of its own design. Josef Frank alone left behind 2,000 furniture sketches and about 160 textile designs. The store also has furniture and other objects by some of the most skilled designers and craftsmen of our time. www.svenskttenn.se/en/

Shopping, this is the place for affordable shopping, especially of the young and trendy variety. Drottninggatan and the area between Sergels Torg and Kungsträdgården are full of apparel brands. They also share the area with large shopping temples and classic Stockholm department stores such as Åhlens City and NK (Nordiska kompaniet). There are several H&M stores and other large chain stores in the nearby area.
