Decision of ISU Disciplinary Commission

On May 5, 2011, the ISU filed a complaint against Mr. Thibaut Fauconnet, a Short Track Speed Skater and member of the Fédération Française des Sports de Glace (FFSG), for an alleged ISU Anti-Doping Rule violation.

Following consideration of the alleged ISU Anti-Doping Rule violation, the ISU Disciplinary Commission has, on October 10, 2011, taken the following decision:

- 1. Thibaut Fauconnet is declared responsible for an Anti-Doping violation, committed on December 12, 2010 at the Short Track World Cup in Shanghai, China*
- 2. A period of ineligibility of 18 months, beginning on December 27, 2010 and ending on June 26, 2012, is imposed on Thibaut Fauconnet.*
- 3. The Fédération Française des Sports de Glace has to reimburse the ISU for the costs of these proceedings and the laboratory fees of the Anti-Doping testing.*
- 4. The skater bears his own costs.*

Additional details concerning this decision of the Disciplinary Commission are published on the ISU website.

This decision has been appealed against at the Court of Arbitration for Sport (CAS) by FFSG concerning the duration of the suspension and by the ISU concerning the disqualification of the results obtained subsequent to the Anti-Doping violation.
