Decision of ISU Disciplinary Commission

On March 6, 2012 the ISU filed a complaint against Ms. Anastasia Galyeta, an Ice Dancer Figure Skater from Ukraine, for an alleged ISU Anti-Doping Rule violation.

Following consideration of the alleged ISU Anti-Doping Rule violation, the ISU Disciplinary Commission has, on May 21, May 23, 2012 respectively, taken the following decision:

“Decision

- 1. Anastasia Galyeta is declared responsible for an Anti-Doping violation, committed on December 10, 2011 at the ISU Junior Grand Prix Final in Quebec, Canada.*
- 2. A period of ineligibility of 18 months, beginning on December 10, 2011 and ending on June 9, 2013 is imposed on Anastasia Galyeta.*
- 3. The Ukrainian Figure Skating Federation has to reimburse the ISU for the costs of these proceedings and the laboratory fees of the Anti-Doping testing.*
- 4. The skater bears her own costs.”*

The decision of the Disciplinary Commission is published in full on the ISU website.

This decision is subject to appeal to the Court of Arbitration for Sport (CAS) within 21 days as of May 24, 2012.

Furthermore according to Article 9 of the ISU Anti-Doping Rules, which states that “A violation of these ISU Anti-Doping Rules in *Individual Sports* in connection with an *In-Competition* test automatically leads to *Disqualification* of the result obtained in that *Competition* with all resulting *consequences*, including forfeiture of any medals, points and prizes”, Ms. Anastasia Galyeta’s competitive results obtained at the 2011 ISU Junior Grand Prix Final in Quebec (8. - 11.12.2011) are disqualified with all the resulting consequences including forfeiture on any medals, points and prizes.
